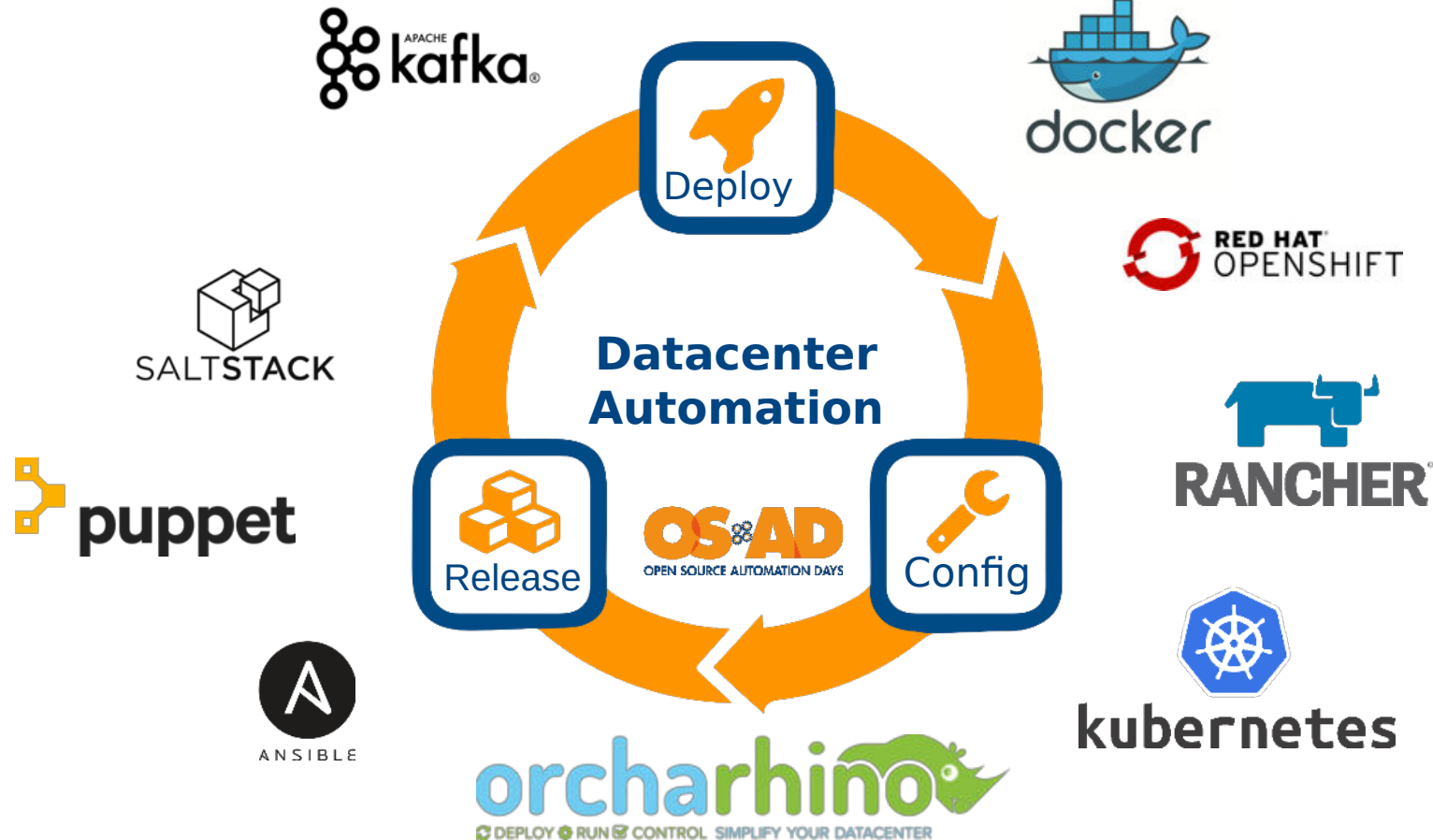

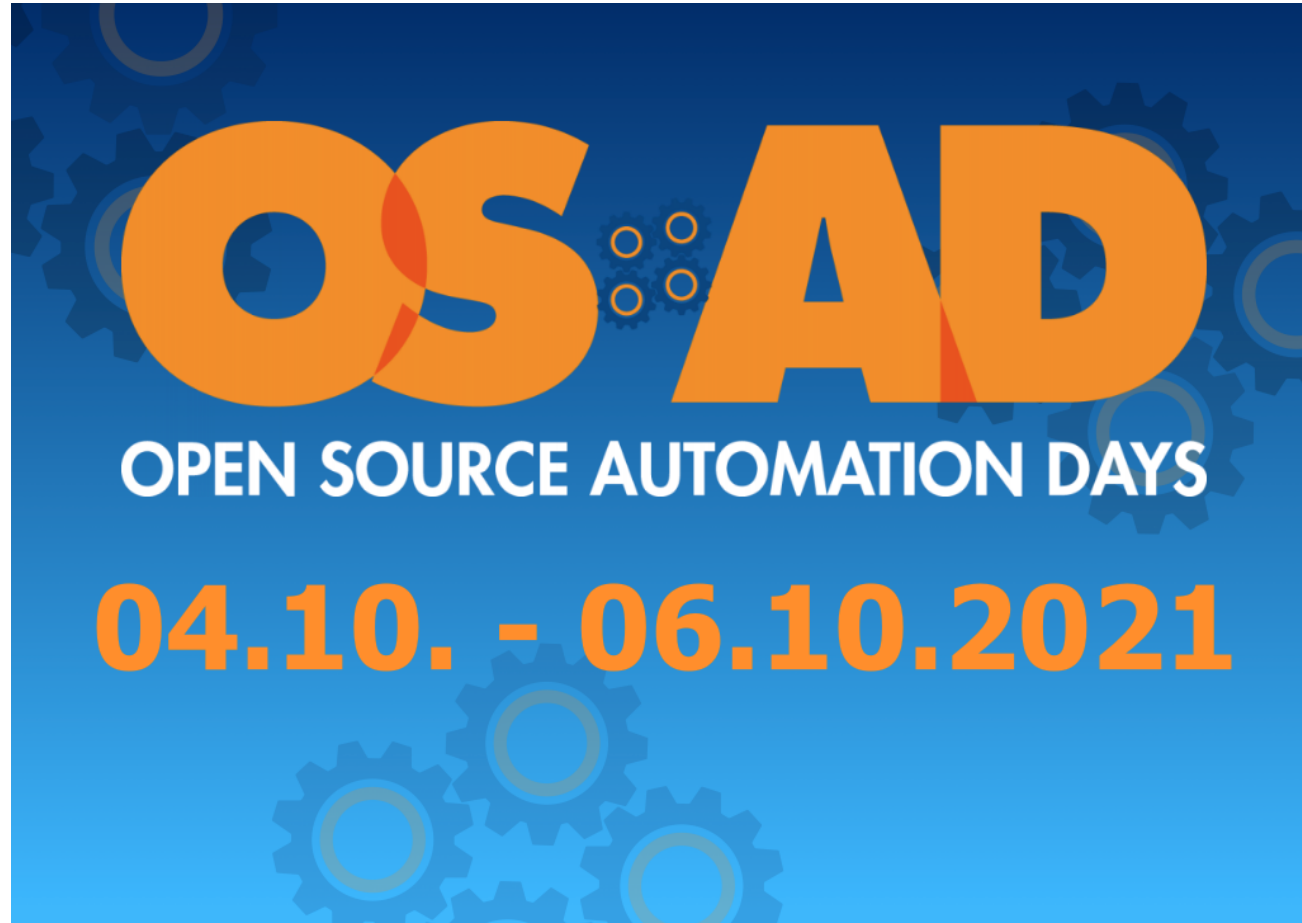

- Host provisioning

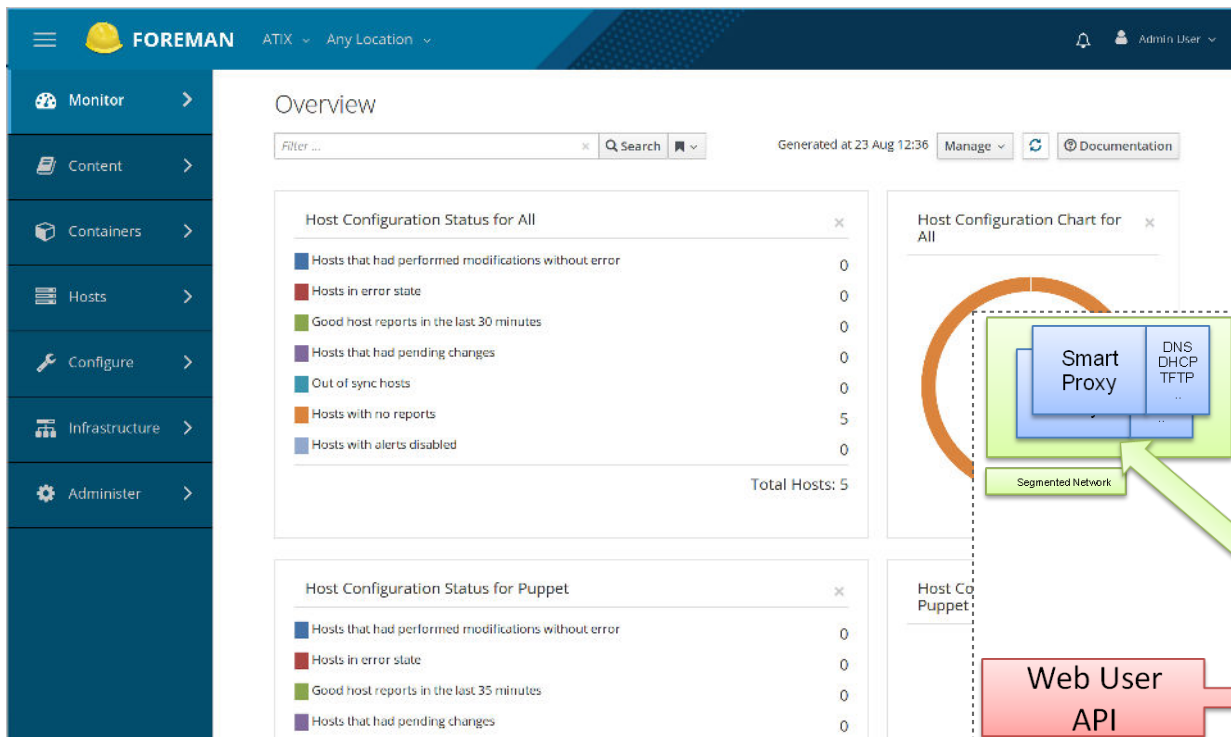

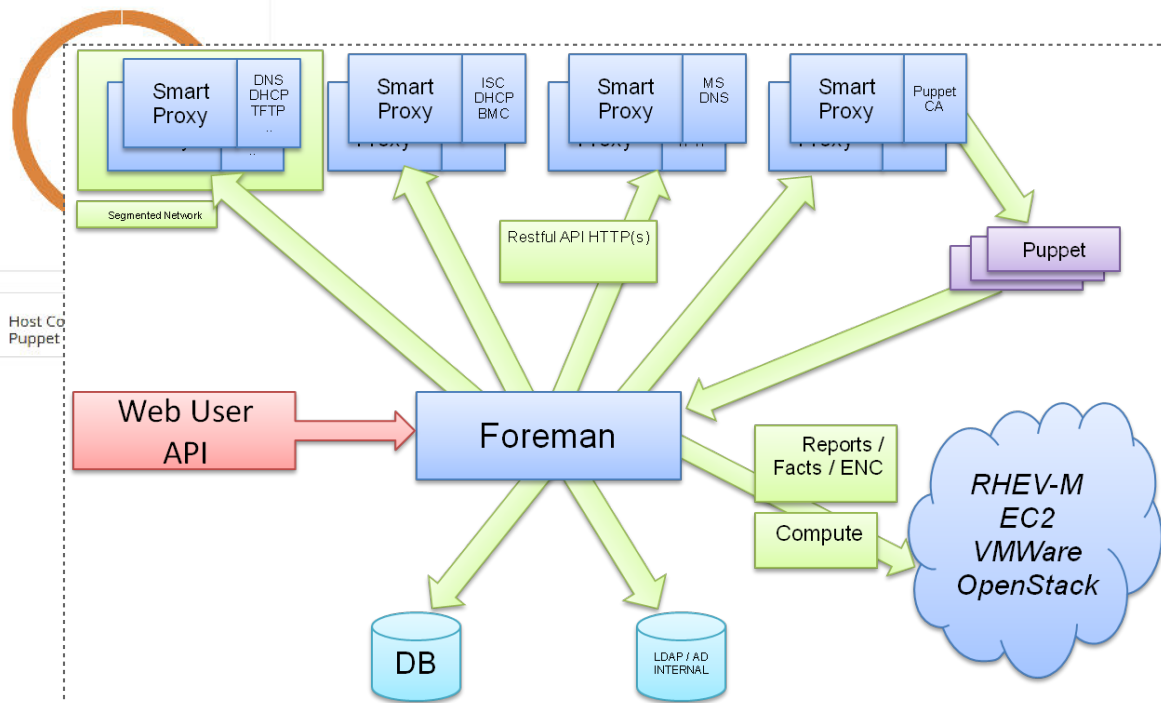

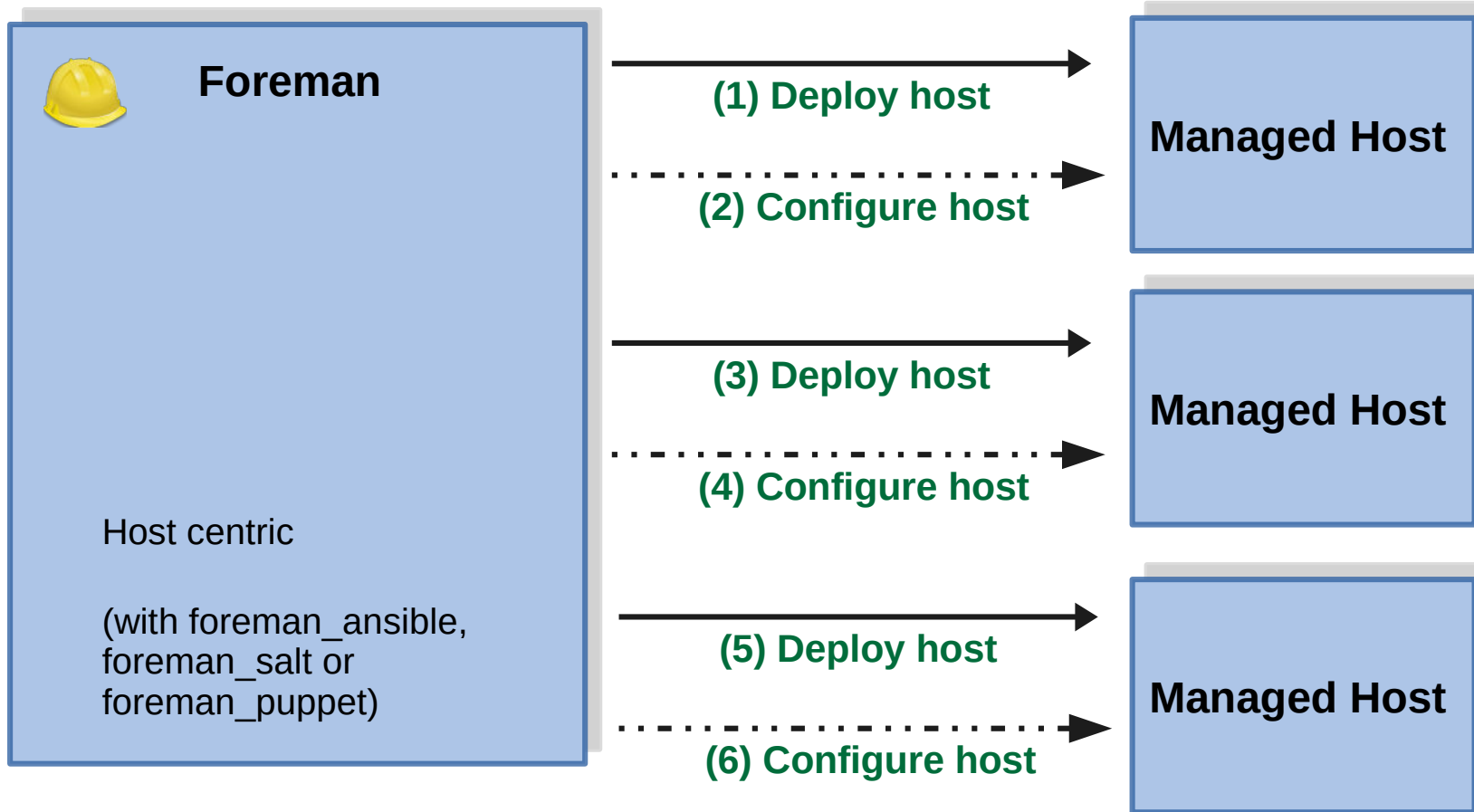
# What we currently need to do...

- Make sure all hosts are up and are „connected“

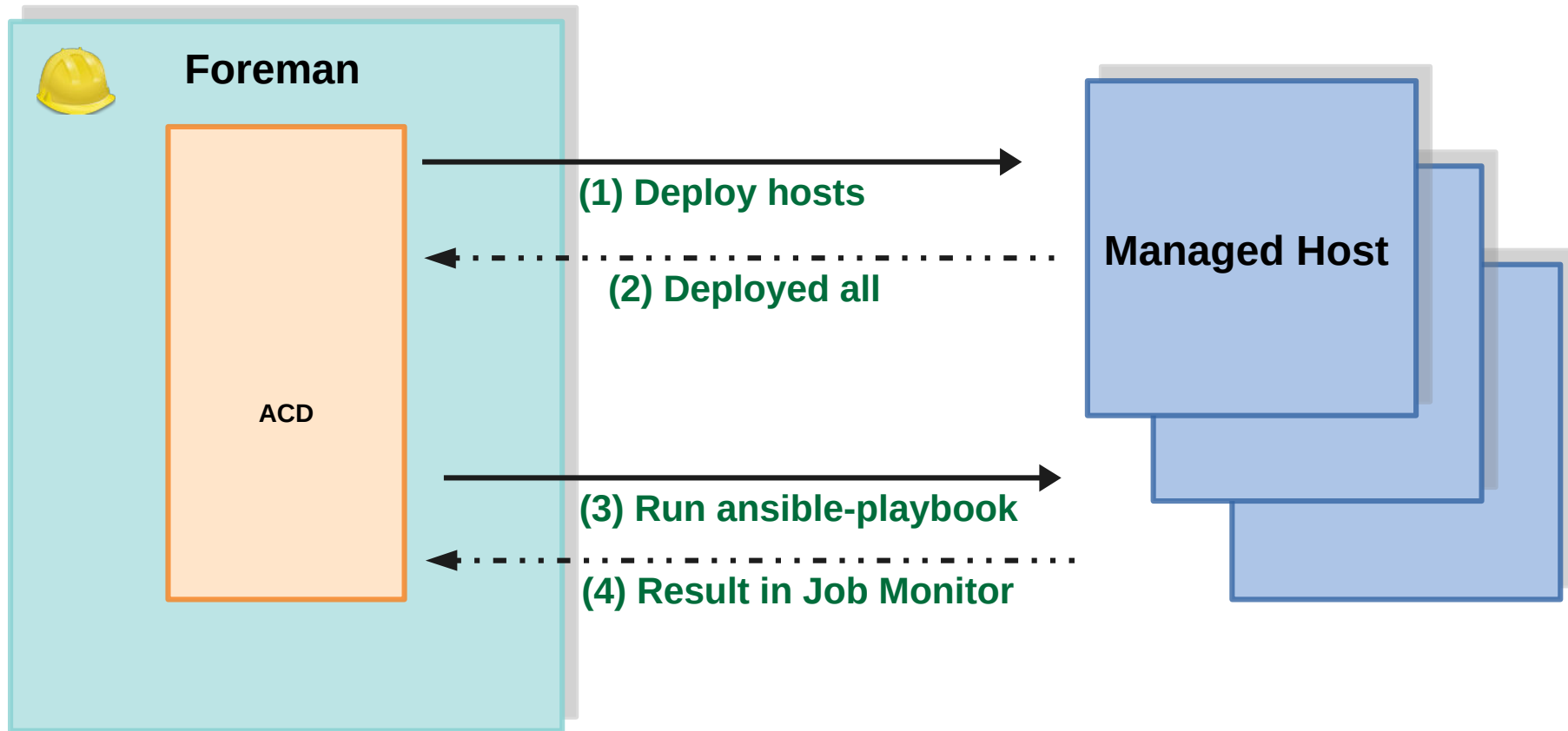

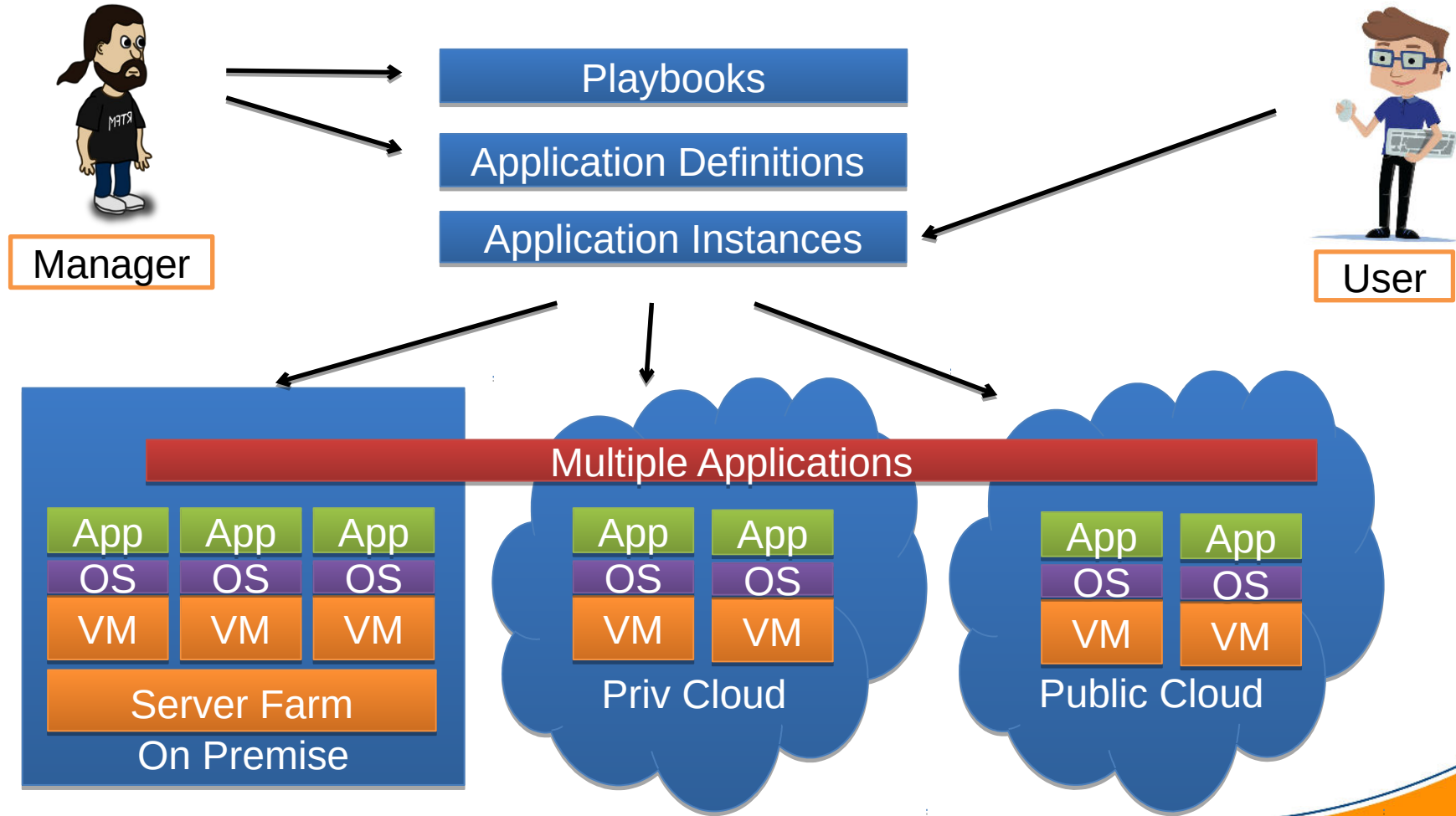

- Process:

1. `aPlaybook = AnsiblePlaybook.new()`
2. `aDefinition = appDefinition.new(aPlaybook)`
3. `aInstance = appInstance.new(aDefinition)`
4. `aInstance.deploy()`
6. `aInstance.configure()`

- Roles

manager: Ansible Playbook & application definition

user: Application instance
